TWO BEST PRACTICES OF THE COLLEGE

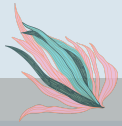
NO VEHICLE DAY

NEW PEDAGOGY

Nowgong Girls' College has introduced a new pedagogy that emphasizes peer evaluation and collaborative learning. 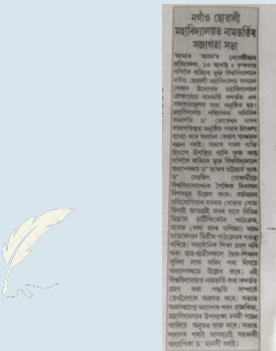


ADMISSION AWARENESS PROGRAMME

SAAs offer holistic care (health, education, emotional). It handles the legal process ensuring children find permanent families legally and responsibly. There are SAAs in every district of India and in Nagaon district it is run by Gramya Puthibharal Santha, Nagaon under District Child Protection Unit, Nagaon.

LAUNCH OF THE CENTRE FOR HANDLOOM AND WEAVING

SEPTEMBER 6, 2025

In September, 2025, the college launched the Centre for Handloom and Weaving to promote economic and entrepreneurial opportunities to the students. Under the initiative of the Centre, a three-month certificate course was introduced where students were provided hands-on training in various techniques, from basic weaving to advanced design, dyeing etc. On 6 September, 2025, the College signed an MoU with Char and Rural Development Society (CARDS) with the objective of encouraging skill based education, promoting and preservation of traditional handloom designs and enhancing livelihood opportunities. The CARDS provided six looms and other paraphernalia necessary for the training of the students. An instructor has been appointed to train the students and altogether 15 students have enrolled in the course until now.

SILKWORM REARING CENTRE

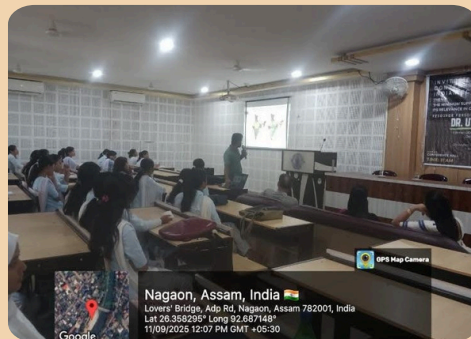

INVITED TALK ON “THE MINIMUM SUPPORT PRICE IN INDIAN AGRICULTURE: ITS RELEVANCE IN CHANGING LANDSCAPE”

SEPTEMBER 11, 2025

The Department of Economics, Nowgong Girls’ College, organized an Invited Talk on “The Minimum Support Price in Indian Agriculture: Its Relevance in Changing Landscape” on 11th September 2025 (Thursday). The resource person for the programme was Dr. Utpal Baishya, Former UGC Senior Research Fellow, Department of Economics, Gauhati University. The programme commenced at 11:00 a.m. with Mrs. Leena Bora Hazari, Associate Professor of the Department, anchoring the session. Dr. Deepak Sarma, Head of the Department of Economics, welcomed the gathering, followed by the inaugural address by Dr. Kulen Ch. Das, Principal of the college. Mr. Binod Goswami then introduced the distinguished speaker to the audience. In his lecture, Dr. Baishya traced the journey of Indian agriculture beginning with the era of the Green Revolution, elaborating on its advantages and limitations. He then provided a comprehensive analysis of the Minimum Support Price (MSP), explaining its significance in the present agricultural scenario and its role in ensuring farmers’ welfare. His insightful presentation covered the multifaceted aspects of MSP and highlighted its relevance in the changing economic landscape. The session witnessed active participation of around 100 students from the Departments of Economics, Political Science, and Geography. The interactive question-answer session further enriched the discussion, where Dr. Baishya patiently clarified the queries of the students with clarity and depth. The programme concluded with a formal vote of thanks, marking the successful culmination of an intellectually stimulating session.



VISIT TO OPEN SHELTER HOME

SEPTEMBER 11, 2025

The Department of Home Science, NGC, visited Open Shelter Home, Nagaon as a part of course work on 11/9/2025. Open Shelter Home is a facility in India that provides short term residential support and care for vulnerable children like street children, abused or separated from families. They provide temporary shelter, medical support, life skill training, education, emotional care and counselling until the children are restored to the families or referred to child care institutes.

CENTRE FOR WOMEN'S STUDIES

The Centre for Women's Studies, Nowgong Girls' College, continued its commitment towards promoting gender awareness, research, and community engagement during the session August-December 2025. The major activities undertaken during this period are outlined below:

Submission of Research Report on Menstrual Health and Hygiene (August 2025)

In August 2025, the Centre completed and submitted a research report based on an extensive survey conducted among adolescent girls. The study aimed to understand their menstrual health and hygiene practices, the challenges they face, and the level of awareness regarding menstrual well-being. The research provided valuable insights that can guide future awareness programmes and interventions for adolescent health.

Training Programme on "Gender Friendly Equipment for Women Farmers"

26th-28th August 2025)

The Centre coordinated with Assam Agricultural University - Zonal Research Station (ZRS), Shillongani, Nagaon, to facilitate a three-day training programme for students of the college. Conducted under the All India Network Project on Jute and Allied Fibre, the training introduced 20 students to various gender-friendly agricultural tools and technologies aimed at reducing drudgery for women farmers.

The programme, held from 26th to 28th August 2025 at Shillongani, offered hands-on demonstrations and expert guidance, contributing significantly to students' understanding of gender-sensitive agricultural practices.

Publication of Edited Book UNMESH (September 2025)

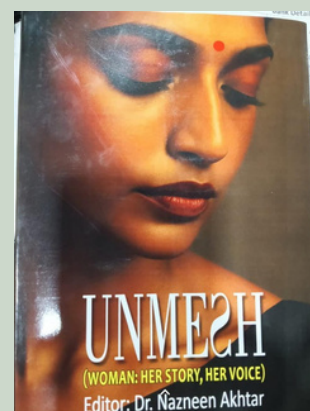
Under the aegis of the Research and Publication Cell of Nowgong Girls' College, the Centre for Women's Studies published an edited volume titled UNMESH, bearing an ISBN number, on the occasion of the College Foundation Day.

The book, edited by Dr. Nazneen Akhtar, Secretary of the Centre for Women's Studies, comprises 15 research papers and articles that delve into diverse aspects of women's lives, experiences, and socio-cultural realities. The publication marks a significant academic contribution by the Centre toward gender studies and feminist scholarship.

Ongoing Study on College Student Dropout (Initiated October 2025)*

In October 2025, the Centre undertook another important research initiative focusing on the issue of college student dropout. The study seeks to identify the factors contributing to dropout rates, particularly among women students, and aims to recommend strategies for retention and academic continuity. The work is presently in progress and is being pursued by the members of the Centre.

During the session August-December 2025, the Centre for Women's Studies actively engaged in research, training, and academic publication. The initiatives undertaken reflect the Centre's ongoing efforts toward advancing gender sensitivity, empowering young women, and contributing to scholarly discourse on women's issues.



EXCURSION TO KOLKATA

OCTOBER 24- 28, 2025

An educational excursion to Kolkata was organized for the students of the Department of Botany with the objective of enhancing their academic exposure and cultural understanding. Lecture Program under MoU

OCTOBER 15, 2025

As part of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed between the Department of English, Nowgong Girls' College and the Department of English, Kaliabor College, a lecture programme was organised by the Department of English, Kaliabor College, on 15 October 2024, to strengthen academic collaboration and facilitate intellectual exchange between the two institutions. Prachurjya Borah of the Department of English, Nowgong Girls' College, delivered a lecture titled "Writing Back: Postcolonial Rewriting in Jean Rhys's Wide Sargasso Sea." The talk introduced students to the concept of postcolonial rewriting and examined how Jean Rhys's novel responds critically to Charlotte Brontë's Jane Eyre. Emphasis was placed on the idea of "writing back" to the colonial canon by recuperating marginalised voices and interrogating dominant imperial and patriarchal narratives. The session was designed specifically for the Fifth Semester students of English Honours, for whom the text discussed forms an essential part of their prescribed syllabus.

The session was interactive, and students actively engaged with the discussion by raising questions on the relationship between Jane Eyre and Wide Sargasso Sea, the relevance of postcolonial theory, and the significance of rewriting as a literary and political strategy. The programme proved academically enriching and successfully met its objectives by enhancing students' critical engagement with the text while reinforcing the spirit of collaboration envisaged under the MOU between the two institutions.

CREATIVE WRITING WORKSHOP

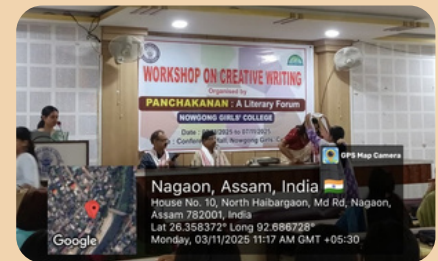
November 1-7, 2025

FIELD TRIP TO BURHACHAPORI WILDLIFE SANCTUARY NOVEMBER 18, 2025

The Department of Zoology, Nowgong Girls' College, organized an educational field trip to Burhachapori Wildlife Sanctuary on 18th November, 2025 as part of the practical and experiential learning component of the curriculum of semester III students. The objective of the visit was to provide students with first-hand exposure to wildlife habitats, biodiversity, and conservation practices.

A total of 33 students participated in the field trip, accompanied by four faculty members from the department. Upon arrival at the sanctuary, the Forest Department, Burhachapori Wildlife Sanctuary, arranged a guided field trek for the students inside the protected area. The trek covered diverse habitats, including grasslands and woodland areas, with special emphasis on the freshwater mangrove ecosystem dominated by *Barringtonia acutangula*. The students were able to observe habitat structure, vegetation patterns, and ecological associations within the sanctuary, enhancing their understanding of wetland and riparian ecosystems.

An interactive and informative session was conducted by Mr. Pranab Barua, Forest Department official from the Dhaniala Range, Burhachapori Wildlife Sanctuary. During the session, Mr. Barua elaborated on the history of the sanctuary, its habitat types, and the diversity of flora and fauna found in the region. He also highlighted the importance of conservation measures, community participation, and the role of protected areas in safeguarding Assam's biodiversity. The session was highly engaging, and students actively participated by asking questions and sharing observations.



After the field activities, the students and faculty members had lunch at 'Gundruk', an Eco-Development Committee (EDC) resort located near the sanctuary and managed by the local community. This provided students with insights into community-based conservation initiatives and sustainable ecotourism models. The field trip proved to be an enriching experience for the students, offering valuable practical exposure and reinforcing classroom learning through direct interaction with natural ecosystems and conservation professionals. The Department expresses its sincere gratitude to the Forest Department, Burhachapori Wildlife Sanctuary, and the Eco-Development Committee for their support and cooperation in making the visit successful.

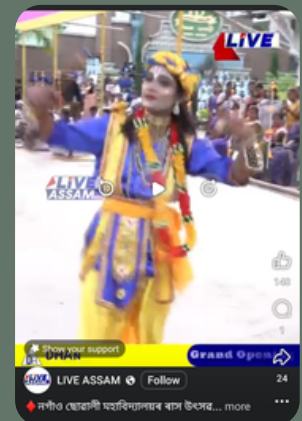

NOVEMBER 22, 2025

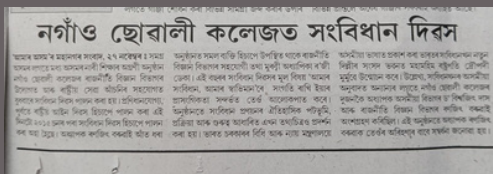

AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON STRAY DOG

SAFETY AND RABIES

NOVEMBER 30, 2025

An awareness programme titled "City Hounded by Strays, Kids Pay the Price" was organised on 30 November 2025 by the Centre for Sustainable Development, Nowgong Girls' College, in association with IQAC-NGC, NGC-NSS Unit, and NGC-Eco Club, at Chinta Juroni Kaksha, Nowgong Girls' College, with the objective of creating awareness about stray dog behaviour, prevention of dog bite incidents, and public health risks associated with rabies.

The programme was coordinated by Mr. Neeraj Bora, Assistant Professor, Department of Zoology, along with Dr. Anjana Begum and Mr. Nitesh Bothra, Assistant Professor, Department of Statistics. Mr. Bora delivered an informative and interactive presentation focusing on human-stray dog coexistence, child safety, and responsible behaviour in stray-dominated urban spaces.

During the session, Mr. Bora explained the ecology and behavioural patterns of stray dogs, highlighting common triggers of aggression such as fear, territoriality, provocation, and competition for food. Special emphasis was laid on children as the most vulnerable group, as their sudden movements, gestures, and lack of awareness often unintentionally provoke aggressive responses from stray dogs.

The presentation covered practical Do's and Don'ts while encountering stray dogs, including:

- Remaining calm and avoiding sudden movements or direct eye contact.
- Not running or screaming when approached by a dog.
- Avoiding feeding or teasing stray dogs without adult supervision.
- Practicing caution during early morning and late evening hours.
- Taking immediate and appropriate steps in case of a dog bite or scratch.

Mr. Bora also provided detailed awareness on rabies, a fatal yet preventable viral disease. The session included information on the modes of rabies transmission, early symptoms in humans and animals, the importance of immediate wound washing with soap and running water, and the necessity of timely post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) and vaccination. The role of sterilisation, vaccination, and humane management of stray dogs in effective disease control was also emphasized upon.

The programme highlighted the importance of community participation, responsible waste management, and coordination with civic authorities in addressing the growing stray dog issue in a sustainable and humane manner.

The meeting was graced by the presence of the Principal, Dr. Kulen Ch. Das, IQAC Coordinator, Dr. Sanchita Bora, members of the NGC-Eco Club, teachers from various departments, and a large number of students who actively participated in the discussion.

The programme concluded with an interactive question-and-answer session, followed by concluding remarks underscoring the need for awareness-based solutions rather than fear-driven responses, and reaffirming the collective responsibility of citizens, educational institutions, and authorities in ensuring public safety and animal welfare.
