

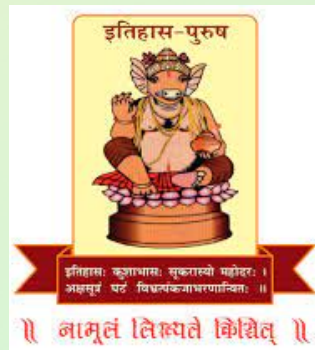

About the College

Nowgong Girls' College is a premier institution of higher education for women in central Assam. It has been continuing its glorious journey since 12th September, 1962. The college is located in the district of Nagaon in Central Assam. The district is on the south bank of the Brahmaputra River between latitudes 25°45' to 26°45' North and longitudes 91°50' and 93°20' East. It is bounded by Sonitpur and the Brahmaputra to the North, West Karbi Anglong to the South, East Karbi Anglong and Golaghat to the East and Morigaon to the West. It has travelled a long way imparting higher education to the aspiring girl students of Nagaon and its adjoining districts. It is affiliated to Gauhati University and is included under Section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. The college, at present, has 18 departments in both Arts and Science streams at the under-graduate level with more than 2000 enrolled students. The College was re-accredited at 'A' Grade by the NAAC (2nd Cycle).

About the Seminar

The history of the freedom struggle is a glorious part of Indian history and it is full of selfless services, hard work and sacrifices made by the people of India. The history of North East India is witness with various unknown facts of the freedom struggle. Many facts and figures of the freedom struggle, role of women participation in particular of North East India are not highlighted in Indian history that remains in darkness. The women of North East India were progressive due to influence of both patriarchal and matriarchal type of society. Women of North East India are relatively free from the social evil, bad practices and superstitions. The significant enhancement of women status in North East India began to come forth since their participation in National Movement against the British and it had enhanced their political status in society. Emphasis was given on the introduction of laws for social reforms and on women education for the women empowerment during colonial period. Kanaklata Baruah, Paona Brajabashi, Rani Gaidinliu, Haipou Jadonang, Ropuiliani and Bhogeswari Phukononi are the prominent women freedom fighter of North East India and their history is known very well but there were many other women from North East India who sacrificed their lives during freedom movement remained unknown and put to darkness. Our main goal of the proposed seminar is to highlight the unheard and unknown story and event of Women's of North East India during freedom movement.

The people of present day simply knows some of the great freedom fighter of North East India but are still ignorant of the role of women freedom fighters of North East India and their participation, contribution and sacrifices in making India free from British rule. So we think that it is essential to reread, reinterpret, restore and conserve and bring forth the role of the women freedom fighters in different phases of the freedom struggle with an aim to restore a new sprit and enthusiasm in the minds of the people and reconstructing the feeling of integration among the people and making them to feel oneness and proud about the contribution of the women in freedom struggle of North East India.

- ✓ Accepted full papers will be published in book form with ISBN number.

Guidelines for Full Paper Submission

1. All papers that are submitted must be original, unpublished, and not currently under review by any journal or for any other conference. The papers must be written in MS word document (A4 size), Times New Roman, 12 font size, and 1.5 line spacing.
2. Each paper should include the following sections: (i) Introduction, (ii) Materials and methods, (iii) Results and Discussion (v) Conclusion, and (vi) References.
3. The full paper should not contain more than 4000 words.
4. A paper should not exceed 10 pages. References should be as per the APA style.
